Library Instruction to Promote Information Literacy

Library faculty partner with other Linfield faculty in teaching information literacy class sessions within courses such as the first year Inquiry Seminars, the introductory course to majors and senior seminars. Linfield library faculty also offer individual deep research consultations for faculty and students.

Library Liaison Program

UL uses the liaison librarian framework to ensure that all departments receive equitable services. The University Librarian assigns librarians to each school and division. A liaison is a library faculty designated as the formal contact person between the library and a particular academic unit. In keeping with the UL mission, the primary responsibility of a liaison is to meet the unit's information needs through instruction, collection development, and research assistance to faculty and students.
