<sup>1</sup> To maintain curricular integrity, 8 credits must be discrete to the minor and cannot be used to fulfill any other degree requirement (major, minor, LC). A minimum of 4 credits must also be taken from upper-division (300-level or above) courses.

<sup>2</sup> Other courses from any discipline (including INQS and study abroad) may meet an elective requirement with approval from the coordinator of the program and the relevant department.

<sup>3</sup> Note that clinical work would fulfill this requirement for nursing students.

## STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES
